The committee

The Communications, Advocacy and Political Engagement Committee reports to Provincial Executive Council on matters related to public education; recommends activities designed to heighten awareness of the importance and benefits of public education, and the essential role played by professional teachers; and advises on matters related to public relations and communications, especially pertaining to the image of teachers. Further, the committee reviews, assesses and evaluates the Association's ongoing political involvement program to advise Council on matters related to political engagement.

The commitment

The committee position is an opportunity to share your voice and represent your colleagues at the provincial level. As a committee member, you would attend the committee's meetings (four per school year, in Edmonton or virtual). You would come prepared to speak to—from your perspective as a field member—the forces affecting the committee's work.

The Association covers travel and incidental costs incurred, as well as release time when required, to enable field members to attend committee meetings.

The candidacy

Members must hold the highest level of membership available to them to serve on a committee. The successful candidate will possess experience in matters related to public relations, communications and/or political engagement. Experience as a local communications officer or local political engagement officer is an asset. In addition, consideration shall be given to those who have evidenced commitment to the Association through attendance at the Annual Representative Assembly or the Summer Conference, and/or the holding of office in a local, specialist council, bargaining unit or convention association. Candidates for committee positions are selected to serve on the basis of their expertise, their commitment to the Association and, in some cases, their geographic location and area of specialization.

Consideration will also be given to applicants who self-identify as belonging to equity-seeking groups in order to recognize diverse viewpoints that have traditionally been under-represented. Please note that, to promote broad representation, members already serving on a standing committee of the Association in 2026/27 are infrequently named to an additional standing committee.

All applicants are encouraged to reach out to their district representative(s) to better understand the work that Association committees undertake.
